Help us raise awareness of the importance of putting our waste in the right place, to help protect our environment and increase biodiversity in Suffolk.

We need you to make **LARGE SCALE ARTWORKS** using recycled materials, to make a fabulous display for the Suffolk Recycling stand at the Suffolk Show!

INSTRUCTIONS



1. We are asking your school or group to make a large group artwork celebrating nature and encouraging biodiversity
2. Your artwork should be large **but no larger than 1.2 X 1.5 metres overall**.
3. **Artwork should be sturdy and able to be outside in Suffolk Show weather!** (we try to protect from the rain as much as we can but please make them as strong as possible)
4. **All materials should be securely glued or attached** so they won't fall off outside.
5. Your artwork should be decorated on one side only and be flat on the back so we can attach them to the display.
6. Your artwork can be realistic or fantastical—the more creative the better!
7. We can only accept up to **2 pieces** from each school.
8. You can use **heavy duty cardboard or wood** for the basic cut-out shape (re-used or recycled if possible).
9. Decorate using any re-used or recycled materials.
10. Please let caroline.fish@suffolk.gov.uk if you are going to take part, stating what you are planning to make **by Monday 20 April** at the latest.
11. Artwork to be **delivered/collected by Monday 13 May**. Please clearly label with your school name on the back so I know where it came from!
